

## TIME MACHINE – PRE & POST VISIT LESSON PLANS

### *Your workshop at Madame Tussauds . . .*

Students will be visiting Madame Tussauds to step forwards and backwards in time. They will be invited to explore new worlds, past, present and future – increasing their understanding of historical context while also developing empathy skills. Together, they will take characters from Madame Tussauds into the Time Machine and explore the concept of *fame through the ages*.

The core objectives of these corresponding lessons include but are not limited to:

1. Identifying significant individuals throughout history
2. Understanding how individuals are shaped and challenged by the historical contexts in which they live
3. Empathising with individuals from different historical periods
4. Gaining historical perspective by placing knowledge in different contexts
5. Understanding the history of Madame Tussauds and its founder: Marie Tussaud
6. Exploring different historical contexts through drama, role-play and writing

Subject links: History, Literacy, Drama, Personal, Social, Health Education (PSHE) (UK), Citizenship, Critical Literacy, National Health Education Standards (NHES) (US), Morality and Society curriculum (China).

## PRE- AND POST-VISIT LESSONS

### OBJECTIVES & OUTCOMES

This pack provides material for at least two, hour-long lessons; the first should be delivered *before* visiting Madame Tussauds, and the second should be delivered *after* visiting, to consolidate learning.

#### *Pre-visit Lesson: Celebrities Through History*

##### *Objectives:*

- To identify significant figures throughout history and their achievements
- To carry out research into the different historical contexts of two significant individuals and challenges that they faced
- To create a dialogue between two significant individuals from different historical periods

*Outcomes: Completed research into two significant individuals from different periods in history; a dialogue and role-play between the two individuals.*

#### *Post-visit Lesson: Celebrity Interviews*

##### *Objectives:*

- To empathise with a significant individual from history by acting in-role as that person
- To convey a character through appearance, voice, body language, and facial expression
- To understand and use the conventions of a modern interview

*Outcomes: A diary entry in role as Marie Tussaud; a list of questions to ask a celebrity from another historical period; a modern-day interview with a celebrity performed as a piece of drama.*

## PRE-VISIT LESSON

### CELEBRITIES THROUGH HISTORY

Lead-in questions:



- Which significant historical individuals or 'celebrities' can you think of?
- What makes someone 'significant' in world history?
- Which significant individuals do you hope to see on your visit to Madame Tussauds?

Task 4:

## POST-VISIT LESSON

### CELEBRITY INTERVIEWS

Recap questions:

- Think back to your visit to Madame Tussauds. What did you learn?
- Which significant individuals did you learn about or encounter on your visit?
- If you could meet any one significant individual from history, who would it be?

Task 1:

Write a diary entry in-role as Marie Tussaud as she reflects on her modern-day interview from the Time Machine Workshop. How would she feel about the interview? What questions would she have about the modern world and how her legacy still has an impact in the 21<sup>st</sup> century?

Task 2:

Choose another historically significant individual that you met on your visit to Madame Tussauds.

Come up with a list of three questions that you would like to ask your chosen person if you could interview him or her in real life.
